

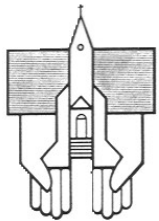
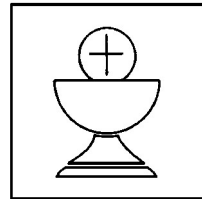

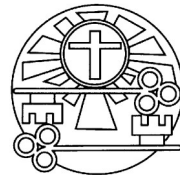

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and for God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it bows the knee to the Bible's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament. **For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.**



WELCOME! We invite all visitors to sign the guest register in the narthex and worship with us again. If you are not a first time visitor and are not communing, please complete the card located with communion cards in front of the pews. If you have questions about how to join our church or study the Scriptures with us, please speak with one of our Elders or the Pastor.

Each Saturday evening from 6-8PM Pastor Rappe avails himself for private confession and absolution, that which the historical Lutheran Church refers to as the third Sacrament. This is made available to those whose consciences are burdened and whose hearts are troubled. No one is forced to make private confession, as no one is forced to Baptism or the Holy Supper. Rather, this is the means of God's gospel to those who seek Him and the forgiveness of sins in Jesus.

HOLY GOSPEL

Therefore you now have sorrow; but I will see you again and your heart will rejoice, and your joy no one will take from you.

DIVINE SERVICE

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What is an “acolyte”?

The acolyte is the person (or persons) who lights the candles before the service. The word acolyte comes from the Greek word *akolouthos* which means “follower.” In English, the word acolyte sometimes means “attendant.”

Why do we use acolytes in the Church?

Acolytes have always been an important part of worship. For centuries, acolytes have attended to the service of God’s people by helping the pastor in many different ways. In our churches today, acolytes

primarily serve by lighting the candles. Acolytes wear robes and sit apart from the congregation because they are helping the pastor to serve God’s people during the service. Wow! What an important job!



Parents:

During the Divine Service, point out the acolyte to your children. If they are too young at the time, encourage them that one day they will get the opportunity to be an acolyte. Remind them that being an acolyte is a very important job for children to have in the church.



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Sunday School Notes
Week of: Sunday, May 3, 2020
Season: Easter

Today is: The Fourth Sunday of Easter, **Jubilate**. "Jubilate" comes from the Latin verb "jubilare", meaning "shout for joy". We sing in reference to this in our Psalm today: "***Shout for joy to God, all the earth; sing the glory of his name; give to glorious praise!***" (Psalm 66:1-2).

There are seven weeks in the Easter season, a total of 50 days.

Church Paraments: The church paraments are now **white**. White is used to represent purity and completeness. We now rejoice because Christ has triumphed over death, and white reinforces that joy. White also reminds us of in Isaiah 1:18, "though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be white as snow."
