

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and for God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it bows the knee to the Bible's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament. For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.





WELCOME! We invite all visitors to sign the guest register in the narthex and worship with us again. If you are not a first time visitor and are not communing, please complete the card located with communion cards in front of the pews. If you have questions about how to join our church or study the Scriptures with us, please speak with one of our Elders or the Pastor.

Each Saturday evening from 6-8PM Pastor Rappe avails himself for private confession and absolution, that which the historical Lutheran Church refers to as the third Sacrament. This is made available to those whose consciences are burdened and whose hearts are troubled. No one is forced to make private confession, as no one is forced to Baptism or the Holy Supper. Rather, this is the means of God's gospel to those who seek Him and the forgiveness of sins in Jesus.



"Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravenous wolves. You will know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes from thornbushes or figs from thistles? Even so, every good tree bears good fruit, but a bad tree bears bad fruit. A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a bad tree bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Therefore by their fruits you will know them.



Sunday School Notes Week of: Sunday, August 2, 2020

Season: Trinity

Today is: The 8th Sunday after Trinity. Trinity season lasts several weeks, leading us into the Advent season, making it the longest season in the church year. In the church year, we now celebrate the doctrine of the Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

<u>Church Paraments</u>: The church paraments are now **green**. This season is sometimes referred to as the "green meadow" season. This is because there are several weeks in the Trinity season; also, the Sundays to come emphasize and teach us about growing and maturing as believers of Jesus Christ.

Symbol:

A descending dove is the frequent representation of the Holy Spirit. Around the dove is an outline of a triangle and three circles, also representing the Trinity.

The dove as a symbol comes from the gospels recording of Jesus' baptism, where the heavens opened up and the Holy Spirt came down in a form of a dove.

Remember what our catechism teaches about the Holy Spirit: "I believe I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the **Holy Spirit** has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith."


ALTAR FLOWERS today are aiven to the glory of God by members of ORLC.
