Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and for God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it bows the knee to the Bible's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament. For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.





WELCOME! We invite all visitors to sign the guest register in the narthex and worship with us again. If you are not a first time visitor and are not communing, please complete the card located with communion cards in front of the pews. If you have questions about how to join our church or study the Scriptures with us, please speak with one of our Elders or the Pastor.

Each Saturday evening from 6-8PM Pastor Rappe avails himself for private confession and absolution, that which the historical Lutheran Church refers to as the third Sacrament. This is made available to those whose consciences are burdened and whose hearts are troubled. No one is forced to make private confession, as no one is forced to Baptism or the Holy Supper. Rather, this is the means of God's gospel to those who seek Him and the forgiveness of sins in Jesus.

All this was done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying:


"Tell the daughter of Zion,

Hosanna in the highest!"


And when He had come into Jerusalem, all the city was moved, saying, "Who is this?"

Dear Partner,

Cumberland County Department of Social Services currently serves over 900 children in foster care who have been removed from their families because of abuse, neglect or dependency. The holidays can be a very difficult time for many of these children. In an effort to remind our foster children that they are special, we are partnering with the community to ensure that these children are not forgotten during the holiday season.

We need your assistance to create a joyful season for children in foster care. We are seeking churches, local businesses, and organizations to assist us with providing holiday gifts or gift cards for children of all ages. We understand that you cannot help every child in our custody, but we welcome and appreciate all that you can do. Every little bit helps and makes a significant impact in the lives of our foster children.

If you would like to donate gifts and gift cards to our children in foster care, you may bring them to Cumberland County Department of Social Services at 1225 Ramsey St. We will be more than happy to come to your church or organization to pick up donations if you are unable to deliver them to CCDSS. We would like to receive all donations between December 1, 2020, and December 7, 2020, to ensure that we have ample time to distribute the gifts to our children before the Holidays.

We are also asking this year that toys be dropped off on the side of the building across from parking lot B. There is a side door that will be available for toys to be dropped off to help maintain as much social distancing as possible in an effort to keep our vendors as well as staff safe in this COVID environment.

The toys that we could use mostly this year are larger items. For example: Baby dolls, doll houses, games, bicycles, stuff animals, footballs, basketballs, soccer balls, educational toys, cars, trucks, action figures, Lego's, Barbie dolls, coloring books and age appropriate toys for infant and toddlers just to name a few. Please attempt to minimize the number of small toys donated as they can be choking hazard for small children.




If we have missed anybody's birthday or anniversary, please let us know.

ST ANDREW, APOSTLE—NOVEMBER 30

Andrew was born in Bethsaida, a village in Galilee. He was a fisherman, the brother of Simon Peter, and the first apostle to follow Jesus (John 1:35-40). He then brought his brother to Christ. Tradition claims that he was martyred at Patras in Achaia on November 30. The tradition that he was crucified on an X-shaped cross seems to be no older than fourteenth century. The celebration on his martyrdom began in the East in perhaps the fourth century, and by the sixth century it had spread to Rome. He is held in particular honor in Scotland. Greece and Russia.
