St. Luke, Evangelist—October 18

Luke was a Gentile physician, a follower of Christ, and a companion of Paul. Little else is known of his life. The two -volume work, the third gospel and Acts, is attributed to him. Tradition says that he was perhaps the other disciple with Cleopas on the road to Emmanus, that he was a painter, that he preached in Bithynia, and that he died at the age of 84 in Boetia. He is commemorated in both East and West on October 18. His symbol is a winged ox, suggested by Ezekiel 1:1-10 and 10:8-14.
