






Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and for God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it bows the knee to the Bible's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament. For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

WELCOME! We invite all visitors to sign the guest register in the narthex and worship with us again. If you are not a first time visitor and are not communing, please complete the card located with communion cards in front of the pews. If you have questions about how to join our church or study the Scriptures with us, please speak with one of our Elders or the Pastor.

Each Saturday evening from 6-8PM Pastor Rappe avails himself for private confession and absolution, that which the historical Lutheran Church refers to as the third Sacrament. This is made available to those whose consciences are burdened and whose hearts are troubled. No one is forced to make private confession, as no one is forced to Baptism or the Holy Supper. Rather, this is the means of God's gospel to those who seek Him and the forgiveness of sins in

EPISTLE REVELATION 14:1-7

They sang as it were a new song before the throne, before the four living creatures, and the elders; and no one could learn that song except the hundred and forty-four thousand who were redeemed from the earth. 'We played the flute for you, And you did not dance; We mourned to you, And you did not lament.'



What is a "parament"?

A parament (pronounced PAIR-uhment) is a colored piece of cloth that hangs on the important items of furniture in the sanctuary. Can you



find the altar? You may see a colored piece of cloth hanging on it. This parament is called the "frontal" or "superfrontal." Can you find the pulpit? The pulpit has a parament, too, as do many of the important furniture items in the sanctuary. Look around to see how many paraments are in your church.

Why do we use paraments?

Paraments honor God and beautify His sanctuary based on the seasons of the Church Year. For example, during the season of Pentecost, the paraments are green. During Lent, the paraments are purple. The word "parament" comes from the Latin word "parare" which means "to decorate or adorn." The paraments are not silent decorations. Each parament helps to proclaim the wonderful news of salvation through Jesus Christ!




Parents: Before or after worship, allow your child to get a closer look at the paraments in the sanctuary. (Remind them to be reverent in God's holy places.) Instruct them that the colors might be different than what they would expect at certain times in the Church Year. For example, the paraments are red on Reformation Day even though it falls during the season of Pentecost.



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
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Sunday School Notes

Week of: Sunday, October 30, 2022

Season: Trinity

<u>Today is: The 20th Sunday in the Trinity season.</u> Trinity season lasts several weeks, leading us into Advent season, making it the longest season in the church year. In the church year, we now celebrate the doctrine of the Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Today is also: Reformation Sunday! We remember Martin Luther who nailed the 95 theses on the church door in Wittenberg, Germany. These theses challenged the wrongful ideas from the Catholic Church at the time.

<u>Church Paraments</u>: Because of the festival of Reformation, the paraments and church banners are **red**. Red is used for many festivals in the church year, boldly proclaiming strength and power.

<u>Sunday School Lesson:</u> Our lesson focused on Samson in "The Weakened Judge" (Judges 16:4-31). God grants Samson great strength to defeat the enemies of Gods people. Seeking to overcome Samson, the Philistines bribe Delilah to find the source of Samson's strength. Samson deceives Delilah each time she tries to uncover the secret, but he finally reveals the key to his power. Shorn and blinded by the Philistines, Samson is brought to entertain thousands of revelers at the feast to Dagon. Identifying the house's supporting pillars, Samson prays, and God grants him power to bring down the temple, killing everyone.

Parents: Samson has many talents, just like your child(ren). What's good is to teach them to use their own talents and gifts to help and serve others. Furthermore, Samson is known for his enormous strength. We are all physically strong in some form of another, however we cannot rely on our strength for anything. Paul goes into more detail about this in 2 Corinthians 12! We are true conquerors in Christ.

Bible verse: "God, the Lord, is my strength." Habakkuk 3:19

Reminders: We start every Sunday at 9:00 am in the sanctuary for openings, followed by discussions, and then our lessons upstairs. We encourage children ages Pre-K through middle school to join us. Parents, continue to talk about the weekly lessons at home!

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
