





Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and for God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it bows the knee to the Bible's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament. For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.





WELCOME! We invite all visitors to sign the guest register in the narthex and worship with us again. If you are not a first time visitor and are not communing, please complete the card located with communion cards in front of the pews. If you have questions about how to join our church or study the Scriptures with us, please speak with one of our Elders or the Pastor.

Each Saturday evening from 6-8PM Pastor Rappe avails himself for private confession and absolution, that which the historical Lutheran Church refers to as the third Sacrament. This is made available to those whose consciences are burdened and whose hearts are troubled. No one is forced to make private confession, as no one is forced to Baptism or the Holy Supper. Rather, this is the means of God's gospel to those who seek Him and the forgiveness of sins in Jesus.

HOLY GOSPEL


MATTHEW 22:1-14

And Jesus answered and spoke to them again by parables and said: "The kingdom of heaven is like a certain king who arranged a marriage for his son, and sent out his servants to call those who were invited to the wedding; and they were not willing to come. Again, he sent out other servants, saying, 'Tell those who are invited, "See, I have prepared my dinner; my oxen and fatted cattle are killed, and all things are ready. Come to the wedding." 'But they made light of it and went their ways, one to his own farm, another to his business. And the rest seized his servants, treated them spitefully, and killed them. But when the king heard about it, he was furious. And he sent out his armies, destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy. Therefore go into the highways, and as many as you find, invite to the wedding.' So those servants went out into the highways and gathered together all whom they found, both bad and good. And the wedding hall was filled with guests.

"But when the king came in to see the guests, he saw a man there who did not have on a wedding garment. So he said to him, 'Friend, how did you come in here without a wedding garment?' And he was speechless. Then the king said to the servants, 'Bind him hand and foot, take him away, and cast him into outer darkness; there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'

ST. JAMES, THE BROTHER OF JESUS, OCT. 23

The traditional Western identification of James, the brother of the Lord. with James the Younger (the Less) is rejected by nearly all New Testament scholars, since there is no evidence in the gospels that Jesus' brother was a disciple until he became a witness to the resurrection. The Eastern church commemorates James on this date and the festival has been accepted by several Anglican calendars. St. Paul and the book of Acts both testify to James's presence in the church at Jerusalem and his diplomatic resolution of the dispute between Jew and Gentile at the Council of Jerusalem (Galatians 2: Acts 15). According to church traditions and the Jewish historian Josephus, he was stoned to death. c. 62.

ST. SIMON AND ST. JUDE. APOSTLES—OCTOBER 28

"In the list of the twelve apostles (Matthew 10:2-4: Mark 3:16-19: Luke 6:14-16; Acts 1:13), the tenth and eleventh places are occupied by Simon the Zealot (or "Cananaean") and by Jude (or "Judas," not Iscariot but "of James"), who was apparently known a Thaddaeus. According to early Christian tradition, Simon and Jude journeyed together as missionaries to Persia, where they were martyred. It is likely for this reason, at least in part, that these two apostles are commemorated on the same day. We give thanks to God for calling and sending Simon, along with Jude and all the apostles, to preach and teach the Holy Gospel, to proclaim repentance and forgiveness, and to baptize in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit (John 4:1-2; Matthew 10; 28:16-20; Luke 24:46-49.



What is the "church"?

When someone says the word "church," we usually think of a place people go to worship. The Lutheran Confessions teach us that the church is the "assembly of all the believers among whom the Gospel is preached in its purity and the Holy Sacraments are administered according to the Gospel." Wow! The church is so much more than a building!

If the church is more than just the building, then why is the building and everything in it so important?

The church building, or the "sanctuary," is a place where God is present. We know that our Lord has promised to come to us in His Sacraments. Since God is actually here with us in His house, we should be very reverent, or respectful. We don't want anything in the church pulling us away from what God gives us in His Word and Sacraments. Everything should direct our attention toward Him.



Parents: Before or after the service, direct your children to the wonderfully Gospel-rich symbolism found in the sanctuary, including the on the altar, windows and banners. Remind them that the Lord truly comes to us here in His Word and Sacraments. He brings us what we really need: the forgiveness of sins.

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
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Sunday School Notes

Week of: Sunday, October 22, 2023

Season: Trinity

Today is: The 20th Sunday after Trinity. We

have been in the Trinity Season after Pentecost Sunday. Trinity season lasts several weeks, leading us into Advent season, making it the longest season in the church year.


In the church year, we now celebrate the doctrine of the Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Today we also commemorate St. Simon, St. Jude, and St. James, brother of Jesus.

Church Paraments: The church paraments are now **green**. This season is sometimes referred to as the "green meadow" season. This is because there are several weeks in the Trinity season; also, the Sundays to come emphasize and teach us about growing and maturing as believers of Jesus Christ. Sunday School Lesson: We still continue our lessons in Genesis. Today we looked at Jacob in "A Promising Dream" (Genesis 28:10-22). Jacob undeservedly receives his father's blessing----he and his offspring will dwell in the land of Canaan. As the days of Isaac's life approach the end, Jacob rightly fears for his life. Following the urging of Isaac and Rebekah, Jacob sets out for the house of his uncle Laban. Along the way, Jacob dreams of a staircase reaching to heaven, with the Lord Himself standing at the top. The preincarnate Christ repeats God's promise to give this land to Jacob and his descendants.

Parents: Loneliness can be a real struggle and heavy feeling! It is something probably all have experience and something your child(ren) may already know. Thankfully, God's Word can fill that void, along with our community of Christian brothers and sisters. Furthermore, our bible verses this week reiterates God will never leave us. Prayer is also a powerful tool; remind your child(ren) he/she can come to God and pray for comfort and guidance when feeling lonely. The devil likes to trick us that God abandons us—remind them His Word says otherwise.

Ideas for this week: Memorize as a family Psalm 121:8!

Reminder: We invite ALL children grades Pre-k through 6th grade to join us! Sunday School starts at 9am in the sanctuary. Please be on time.



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
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
