

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and for God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it bows the knee to the Bible's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament. For this reason, quests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.





WELCOME! We invite all visitors to sign the guest register in the narthex and worship with us again. If you are not a first time visitor and are not communing, please complete the card located with communion cards in front of the pews. If you have questions about how to join our church or study the Scriptures with us, please speak with one of our Elders or the Pastor.

Each Saturday evening from 6-8PM Pastor Rappe avails himself for private confession and absolution, that which the historical Lutheran Church refers to as the third Sacrament. This is made available to those whose consciences are burdened and whose hearts are troubled. No one is forced to make private confession, as no one is forced to Baptism or the Holy Supper. Rather, this is the means of God's gospel to those who seek Him and the forgiveness of sins in Jesus.



OLD TESTAMENT PSALM 46

God is our refuge and strength, A very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear. Even though the earth be removed. And though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea; Though its waters roar and be troubled. Though the mountains shake with its swelling. There is a river whose streams shall make glad the city of God, The holy place of the tabernacle of the Most High. God is in the midst of her, she shall not be moved: God shall help her, just at the break of dawn. The nations raged, the kingdoms were moved; He uttered His voice, the earth melted. The LORD of hosts is with us: The God of Jacob is our refuge. Come, behold the works of the LORD, Who has made desolations in the earth. He makes wars cease to the end of the earth: He breaks the bow and cuts the spear in two; He burns the chariot in the fire. Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth! The LORD of hosts is with us; The God of Jacob is our refuge.




serve on the church council, please contact our Council Chairman, Wesley Price. All voting members are urged to attend. We must have a quorum.





What is a "parament"?

A parament (pronounced PAIR-uhment) is a colored piece of cloth that hangs on the important items of furniture in the sanctuary. **Can you**



find the altar? You may see a colored piece of cloth hanging on it. This parament is called the "frontal" or "superfrontal." **Can you find the pulpit?** The pulpit has a parament, too, as do many of the important furniture items in the sanctuary. Look around to see how many paraments are in your church.

Why do we use paraments?

Paraments honor God and beautify His sanctuary based on the seasons of the Church Year. For example, during the season of Pentecost, the paraments are green. During Lent, the paraments are purple. The word "parament" comes from the Latin word "parare" which means "to decorate or adorn." The paraments are not silent decorations. Each parament helps to proclaim the wonderful news of salvation through Jesus Christ!




Parents: Before or after worship, allow your child to get a closer look at the paraments in the sanctuary. (Remind them to be reverent in God's holy places.) Instruct them that the colors might be different than what they would expect at certain times in the Church Year. For example, the paraments are red on Reformation Day even though it falls during the season of Pentecost.



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
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Sunday School Notes

Week of: Sunday, October 29, 2023

Season: Trinity

Today is: The 21st **Sunday after Trinity.** We have been in the Trinity Season after Pentecost Sunday. Trinity season lasts several weeks, leading us into Advent season, making it the longest season in the church year.

In the church year, we now celebrate the doctrine of the Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Church Paraments: Today church paraments are now **red**. This is because of **Reformation Sunday**, where we remember Martin Luther who nailed the 95 theses on the church door in Wittenberg, Germany.

Next Sunday is another special festival, with different colored paraments, see if you can guess what it is!

Sunday School Lesson: We still continue our lessons in Genesis. We again focused our attention on Jacob, years later with his children. In "Hope in Hardship", Jacob's son, Joseph, falls into trouble due to his jealous brothers. The unusual timeline of Joseph's life involves him being despised by his brothers, sold into slavery, attaining success and then losing it all to false accusations, being imprisoned, and serving the court of Pharaoh. Joseph summarizes his life in one sentence addressed to his brothers: "You meant it evil against me, but God meant it for good" (Genesis 50:20).

Parents: The sin around us can sometimes feel overwhelming and troubling. Sometimes we may even question God's will around us and tempted to doubt His love and presence. Your child(ren) may already be learning how sin affects us and seeing suffering happen! We want to assure them God's love is ever true, through His son! Christ empathizes with us (for he too, walked on this Earth) and helps

us in our troubles. He is truly our one and only hope! Another good bible verse to share together is Romans 8:28: "For those who love God all things work together for good, for

those who are called according to His purpose."

Ideas for this week: 1. Learn together the story of Martin Luther and its impact on the church and world history. 2. Joseph could have been angry at his brothers, but instead he showed them love and mercy. How did he do this? How does God show mercy to us? Why does God show us mercy?
