

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and for God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it bows the knee to the Bible's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament. For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.





**WELCOME!** We invite all visitors to sign the guest register in the narthex and worship with us again. If you are not a first time visitor and are not communing, please complete the card located with communion cards in front of the pews. If you have questions about how to join our church or study the Scriptures with us, please speak with one of our Elders or the Pastor.

Each Saturday evening from 6-8PM Pastor Rappe avails himself for private confession and absolution, that which the historical Lutheran Church refers to as the third Sacrament. This is made available to those whose consciences are burdened and whose hearts are troubled. No one is forced to make private confession, as no one is forced to Baptism or the Holy Supper. Rather, this is the means of God's gospel to those who seek Him and the forgiveness of sins in Jesus.

Announcements

The city is laid out as a square; its length is as great as its breadth. And he measured the city with the reed: twelve thousand furlongs. Its length, breadth, and height are equal. Then he measured its wall: one hundred and forty-four cubits, according to the measure of a man, that is, of an angel. The construction of its wall was of jasper; and the city was pure gold, like clear glass. The foundations of the wall of the city were adorned with all kinds of precious stones: the first foundation was jasper, the second sapphire, the third chalcedony, the fourth emerald, the fifth sardonyx, the sixth sardius, the seventh chrysolite, the eighth beryl, the ninth topaz, the tenth chrysoprase, the eleventh jacinth, and the twelfth amethyst. The twelve gates were twelve pearls: each individual gate was of one pearl. And the street of the city was pure gold, like transparent glass.

But I saw no temple in it, for the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are its temple. The city had no need of the sun or of the moon to shine in it, for the glory of God illuminated it. The Lamb is its light. And the nations of those who are saved shall walk in its light, and the kings of the earth bring their glory and honor into it. Its gates shall not be shut at all by day (there shall be no night there). And they shall bring the glory and the honor of the nations into it. But there shall by no means enter it anything that defiles, or causes an abomination or a lie, but only those who are written in the Lamb's Book of Life.

And he showed me a pure river of water of life, clear as crystal, proceeding from the throne of God and of the Lamb. In the middle of its street, and on either side of the river, was the tree of life, which bore twelve fruits, each tree yielding its fruit every month. The leaves of the tree were for healing of the nations. And there shall be no more curse, but the throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it, and His servants shall serve Him. They shall see His face, and His name shall be on their foreheads. There shall be no night there: They need no lamp nor light of the sun, for the Lod God gives them light. And they shall reign forever and ever.

### **EPISTLE**

### **REVELATION 21:1-22:5**

Now I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away. Also there was no more sea. Then I John, saw the holy city, New Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from heaven saying, "Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and He will dwell with them, and they shall be His people. God Himself will be with them and be their God. And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away."

Then He who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new." And He said to me, "Write, for these words are true and faithful."

And He said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. I will give of the fountain of the water of life freely to him who thirsts. He who overcomes shall inherit all things, and I will be his God and he shall be My son. But the cowardly, unbelieving, abominable, murderers, sexually immoral, sorcerers, idolaters, and all liars shall have their part in the lake which burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death.

Then one of the seven angels who had the seven bowls filled with the seven last plagues came to me and talked with me, saying, "Come, I will show you the bride, the Lamb's wife." And he carried me away in the Spirit to a great and high mountain, and showed me the great city, the holy Jerusalem, descending out of heaven from God, having the glory of God. Her light was like a most precious stone, like a jasper stone, clear as crystal. Also she had a great and high wall with twelve gates, and twelve angels at the gates, and names written on them, which are the names of the twelve tribes of the children of Israel: three gates on the east, three gates on the north, three gates on the south, and three gates on the west.

Now the wall of the city had twelve foundations, and on them were the names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb. And he who talked with me had a gold reed to measure the city, its gates, and its wall.

# KIDS IN THE DIVINE SERVICE

Every Sunday morning, God's people gather together to receive the wonderful gifts of salvation. The gifts

that our Lord has for us are delivered in different ways. One of these very important ways is the sermon.

## Why is the sermon so important?

Some people don't like the sermon. They think it is too long, or maybe it is too boring. Some people even try to think of other things while the pastor is preaching. When we are tempted to think this way, we must remember what the sermon is all about. In the sermon, the wonderful Gospel message of Christ and all that He has done for us on the cross is proclaimed. Let them know that the message is not just for adults, but for Jesus' little lambs too! Encourage them to sit and listen to Jesus as he tells them the Good News. If they get lost in the sermon, comfort them by, after the service, explaining things that might have been confusing.



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
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### **Sunday School Notes**

Week of: Sunday, November 5, 2023

**Season: Trinity** 

Today is: The 22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday after Trinity. We have been in the Trinity Season after Pentecost Sunday. Trinity season lasts several weeks, leading us into Advent season, making it the longest season in the church year.

In the church year, we now celebrate the doctrine of the Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

**Church Paraments:** Today church paraments are now white.

Today is also: All Saints Day: this day we commemorate our family members, friends, brothers and sisters in Christ, who have died (merely, fallen asleep—one verse explains this from 1 Thess. 4 "For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep") and now live eternally with Jesus. This gives us bittersweet feelings, as we miss them, but know the joy they have now and the joy we, too, will have when we are called home. In the meantime, the Church in heaven and the Church on earth is one holy Christian Church; and we gather with the saints at the altar and pray with the whole heavens: "Come, Lord Jesus".

**Sunday School Lesson:** We still continue our lessons in Genesis. We again focused our attention on Jacob, years later with his children. In "Hope in Hardship", Jacob's son, Joseph, falls into trouble due to his jealous brothers. The unusual timeline of Joseph's life involves him being despised by his broth-

ers, sold into slavery, attaining success and then losing it all to false accusations, being imprisoned, and serving the court of Pharaoh. Joseph summarizes his life in one sentence addressed to his brothers: "You meant it evil against me, but God meant it for good" (Genesis 50:20).

Parents: The sin around us can sometimes feel overwhelming and troubling. Sometimes we may even question God's will around us and tempted to doubt His love and presence. Your child(ren) may already be learning how sin affects us and seeing suffering happen! We want to assure them God's love is ever true, through His son! Christ empathizes with us (for he too, walked on this Earth) and helps us in our troubles. He is truly our one and only hope! Another good bible verse to share together is Romans 8:28: "For those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose."

Ideas for this week: 1. Learn together the story of Martin Luther and its impact on the church and world history. 2. Joseph could have been angry at his brothers, but instead he showed them love and mercy. How did he do this? How does God show mercy to us? Why does God show us mercy?


