

St. Luke, Evangelist—October 18

Luke was a Gentile physician, a follower of Christ, and a companion of Paul. Little else is known of his life. The two -volume work, the third gospel and Acts, is attributed to him. Tradition says that he was perhaps the other disciple with Cleopas on the road to Emmanus, that he was a painter, that he preached in Bithynia, and that he died at the age of 84 in Boetia. He is commemorated in both East and West on October 18. His symbol is a winged ox, suggested by Ezekiel 1:1-10 and 10:8- 14.

In this type of prayer we ask our Lord to give us His support, assistance and protection. More importantly, we ask Him to keep us strong in the faith and to give faith to other people.
