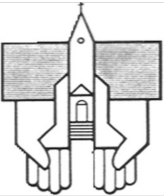

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and for God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it bows the knee to the Bible's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament. **For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.**



WELCOME! We invite all visitors to sign the guest register in the narthex and worship with us again. If you are not a first time visitor and are not communing, please complete the card located with communion cards in front of the pews. If you have questions about how to join our church or study the Scriptures with us, please speak with one of our Elders or the Pastor.

Each Saturday evening from 6-8PM Pastor Rappe avails himself for private confession and absolution, that which the historical Lutheran Church refers to as the third Sacrament. This is made available to those whose consciences are burdened and whose hearts are troubled. No one is forced to make private confession, as no one is forced to Baptism or the Holy Supper. Rather, this is the means of God's gospel to those who seek Him and the forgiveness of sins in Jesus.



PLEASE COMPLETE A COMMUNION CARD: Fill in the names of only those who are communing and hand it to the usher. You may fill out one per family.

While the psalmist urges us to "make a joyful noise to the Lord", he did NOT mean cell phone ringtones, children's noisy toys or other modern electronic marvels. Rather, these should be SILENT while we lift our voices and hearts in worship through song and prayer to our Lord. ST. SIMON AND ST. JUDE, APOSTLES—OCTOBER 28

"In the list of the twelve apostles (Matthew 10:2-4; Mark 3:16-19;
Luke 6:14-16; Acts 1:13), the tenth and eleventh places are occupied
by Simon the Zealot (or "Cananaean") and by Jude (or "Judas," not
Iscaiot but "of James"), who was apparently known a Thaddaeus.
According to early Christian tradition, Simon and Jude journeyed to-
gether as missionaries to Persia, where they were martyred. It is like-
ly for this reason, at least in part, that these two apostles are com-
memorated on the same day. We give thanks to God for calling and
sending Simon, along with Jude and all the apostles, to preach and
teach the Holy Gospel, to proclaim repentance and forgiveness, and
to baptize in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy
Spirit (John 4:1-2; Matthew 10; 28:16-20; Luke 24:46-49.)"
